Grant Purpose: To fund comprehensive projects designed to enhance victim services, implement prevention and education programs, and to develop and strengthen campus security and investigation strategies in order to prevent, prosecute and respond to domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking crimes on college campuses.

TLU Plan: Through this award, in partnership with the Guadalupe Regional Medical Center, the Guadalupe Valley Family Violence Shelter, the 25th Judicial District Attorney, and the Seguin Police Department, TLU will:

- 1) create a comprehensive coordinated community response (CCR) team to develop, implement, and evaluate campus policies and activities addressing sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking (SADDVS);
- 2) hire a project coordinator to oversee facilitate coordinated prevention efforts
- 3) provide ongoing prevention and intervention training on SADDVS for students faculty, and staff;
- 4) implement Green Dot, bystander awareness and intervention training on campus;
- 5) train campus safety, community law enforcement, student conduct board, and peer mentors on SADDVS prevention and intervention strategies;
- 6) incorporate cultural sensitivity and inclusiveness into campus programs, activities, and policies that address SADDVS;
- 7) and develop, in coordination with community partners, Guadalupe County's first sexual assault response team to provide eeffective and responsive victim services.
